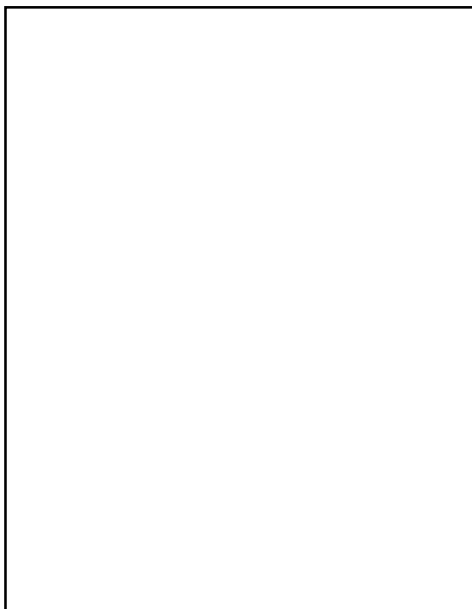

**HELPING LOV CONTINUE  
TO SERVE THE COMMUNITY  
AN UPDATE**

As you know, late last year we advised you that we were on the edge of shutting down our services which have been helping to fill the needs of Fremont, Newark and Union City since 1979. At that time our outstanding debt was \$107,000. The circumstances leading to this was our move and having to split our operations between two locations – both of which had some challenges. As a result we lost 50% of our monthly bingo income – a hefty \$7,000 per month. Through the generosity of so many businesses and individuals, we were able to reduce that debt early this year to \$97,500. We still have not been able to bring bingo back to what it was and probably never will until we have a place of our own, however we have shaved costs. We had to cut our teen program and feel very badly about that, all staff took salary cuts, we cut back some fringes on other programs and added two additional fund raisers – our very successful Halloween Fun & Games and the recent fashion show. We had a wonderful fund raiser planned for May which would have helped reduce our debt another \$15,000 – but were unable to work out a site in any of the 3 cities and had to let that go. Our goal is to find another source of regular monthly income to augment bingo. We have a plan – we just haven't, again, been able to locate the site. However – we are happy to say that because of your generosity in our time of need and the additional fundraisers – we now have reduced the debt to \$85,000. As you can see – we are working very hard to see that we can continue to serve the community for many years to come. With your help, we will.

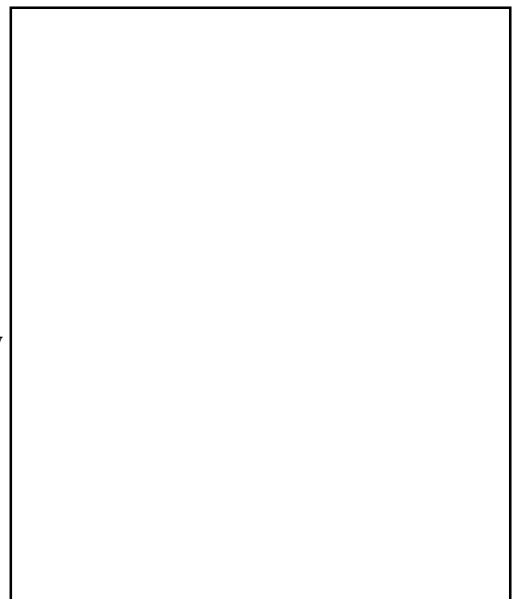
**ITS THEATRE TIME AGAIN**

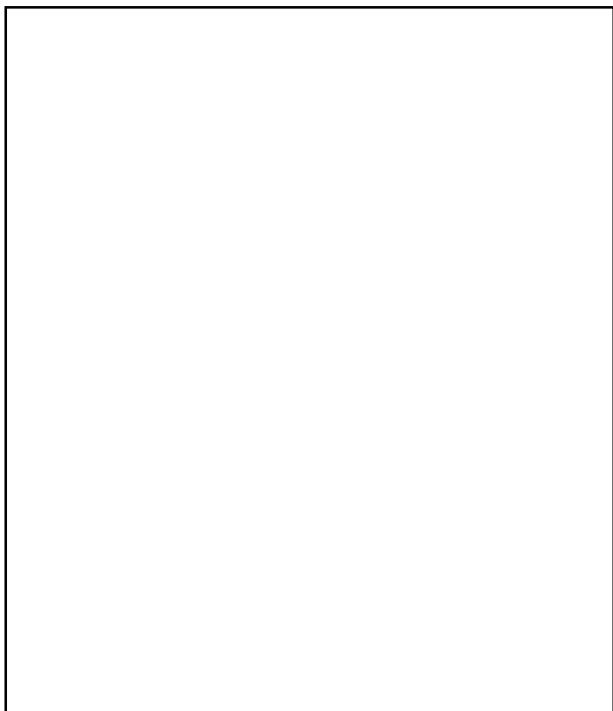

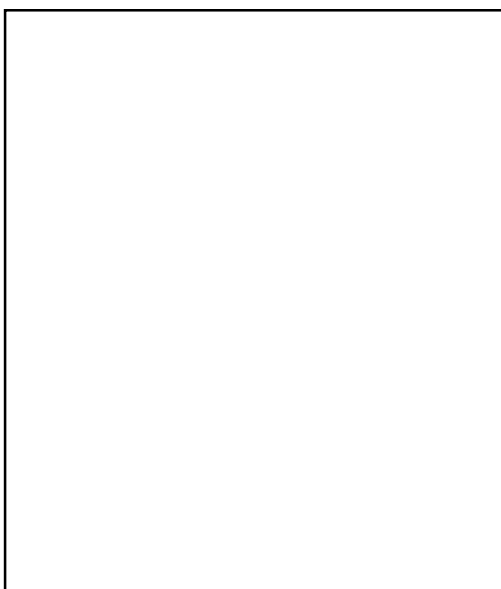

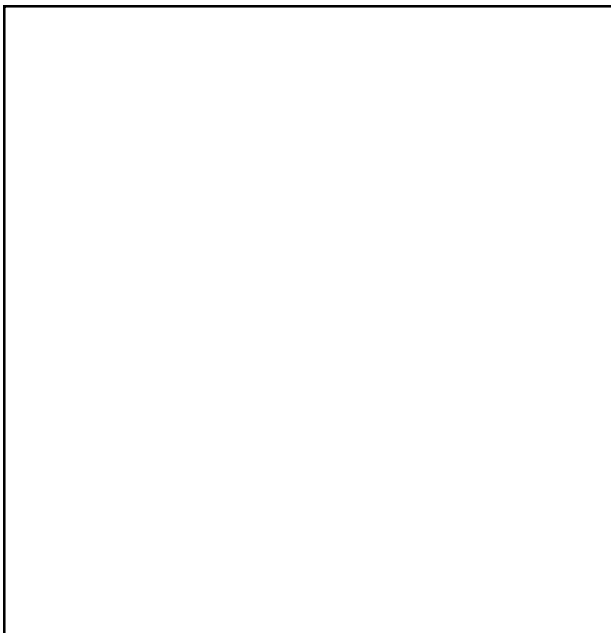

Andrew is a computer expert who keeps our very old equipment up and running, trouble shooting our problems and even though this is the way he earns a living, he donates his services to LOV. The final Board of Directors award given for 2006 is not to an individual, but a group that has been a wonderful LOV supporter for 8 years. It's hard to say how many hours these young people have donated to LOV's programs. They hold annual food drives, getting the whole school involved at Halloween & Spirit Week. However they don't stop there – they continue to collect food for Thanksgiving and Christmas. Since these food drives started – we estimate they have given LOV more than 80,000 items for those in need. 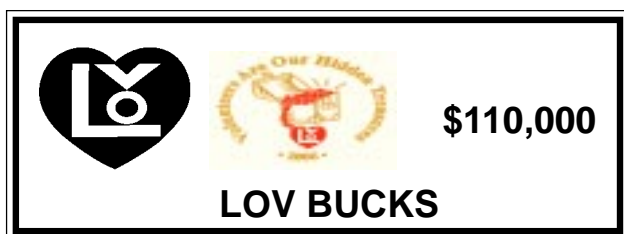

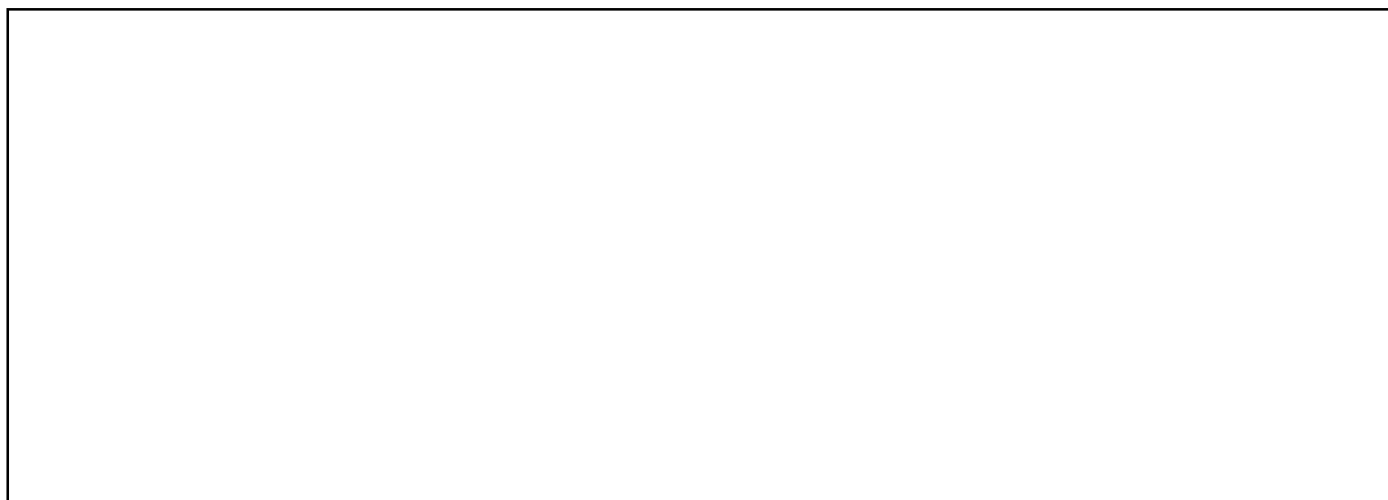

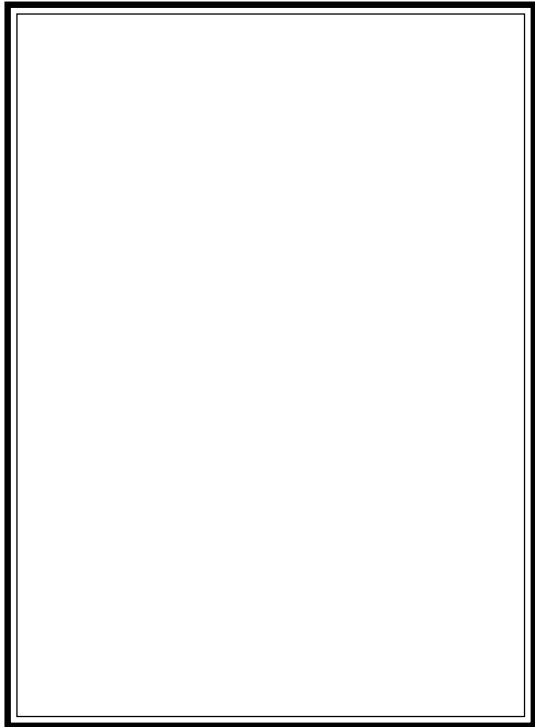
# TROLL DOLLS DISTRIBUTED THRU BOOK BUCKS

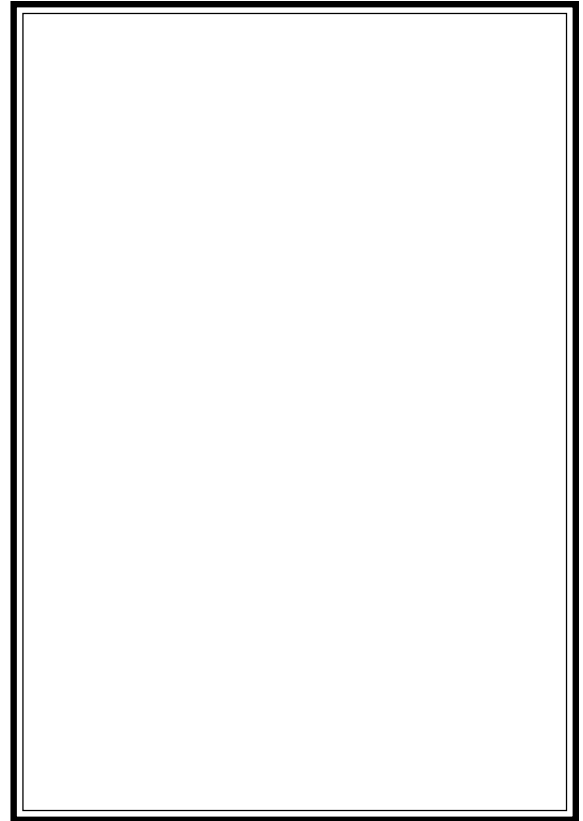
