The Newark Pavilion will be the focus of the traditional Thanksgiving Day food, entertainment, children's crafts and much more. Everyone is invited to enjoy the meal from noon to 3:00 pm. In order to make it easier for guests without transportation to enjoy the day, volunteers will be personally picked up at locations convenient to the guests. All it will take is a phone call to Joanne, LOV's Program Director who is in charge of transportation, at 676-0757 (cell phone) to dispatch a "Turkey Taxi". There will still be 7 guest pick up points posted in Fremont, Newark and Union City where guests may call for a ride.

HOMEBOUND DELIVERIES – we will continue to serve the larger geographic area of Fremont, Newark, Union City, Hayward, San Leandro, San Lorenzo and Castro Valley. A hot Thanksgiving meal and a little companionship are in store for all those who are homebound in these cities. Last year we served 4,182 meals either at the Pavilion or in deliveries to the homebound_ We expect the need will be as great this year. **Which means we need your help more than ever.**

We are a year-round drop off center for food items. At Thanksgiving we are going to pack food boxes for all our guests to take home along with blankets and sleeping bags that will be given to the homeless. **Note: because there is no separate room at the Pavilion – we will not have a “clothing store”.** We no longer distribute clothing from our Center at Ruschin School. There is simply no room. **Food is vital all year round.** For the holidays why don't you plan on adding a few extra cans or cartons for those in need when doing your regular weekly grocery shopping. With your help, our guests will not only have a good Thanksgiving meal, but something extra to take with them to fill the void in the days to come. Don't forget toilet articles. A reminder, when you stay at a hotel even if you don't use those little bottles of shampoo, etc - they have to throw them away and put new ones out for the next room guest. So, take them with you and bring them to LOV – they are the perfect size for the homeless to use and we distribute them throughout the year. Don't forget the babies - they can use diapers and baby food. Bring your donations to LOV, 36120 Ruschin Dr., Newark in the former Ruschin School. Or, if you don't have transportation - call us prior to Thanksgiving at 793-5683 and a volunteer will arrange to pick them up from you.

This is the 14th year that LOV will join forces with the U.S. Marine Corps. to help bring holiday cheer to Tri-City children. LOV is responsible for the distribution of collection barrels, as well as collection, counting and sorting of all the toys received in Fremont, Newark and Union City. All the toys collected will be given to Tri-City agencies such as: Fremont Healthy Start - the Salvation Army, the Viola Blythe Center, Second Chance, Tiburcio Vasquez Clinic & WIC – a total of 24 agencies. Last year we collected 6,595 (1,810 thanks to the Union City Fire Department). Even so, it was not enough to fill all the need. **We need many more collection sites.** If you have, or know of a business that would like to receive a collection barrel, please let us know. Our goal is to deliver all barrels by the 2nd week of November. Final collection will be December 17. For the collection site nearest you, give us a call at 793-5683. Remember - you can always drop off toys here at our Community Service Center, at the former Ruschin School, 36120 Ruschin Drive in Newark. **All toys must be new and unwrapped and will be distributed to Tri City children only.**

If you don't have time to shop - just use the enclosed **HOLIDAY GIVING ENVELOPE** and mark it for Toys For Tots. These funds are very important for us to purchase items for boys and/or girls in age groups where we are short.

WASHINGTON HIGH SCHOOL'S ANNUAL FOOD DRIVE A "HEAVY-WEIGHT" SUCCESS

This is the 6th year that the students of Washington High have held a class challenge food drive. This year they collected a total of 3,673 food items. LOV volunteers weighed them all. Topping the spirit week competition was the Senior Class of 2008 with 1,541 food items weighing 1,710 lbs. The Junior Class of 2009 came in next with a total of 981 items totaling 910 pounds. The Sophomore Class of 2010 was 3rd with 609 items for a total of 668 lbs. And last, but not least was the Freshman Class of 2011 with 542 items for a total of 565.25 lbs. The total weight of this annual drive was 3,852.25 lbs.! Many thanks to these energetic teens for helping to make a difference in the community.
